School improvement strategy:	Develop a whole-school pedagogical approach for the teaching of literacy to provide consistency and a universal lift to student outcomes. Establish a formal observation and feedback process, supported by learning walks protocols, to develop staff capability and to ensure agreed practices are enacted at a class level. Collaboratively review the SCOC to implement systematic consistent behaviour management practices. Consistently implement instructional routines for the teaching of reading. Engage in collaborative discussion of responsive pedagogies through ongoing moderation processes in PLCs. Strengthen teacher capability in understanding, teaching, and assessing reading within the Australian Curriculum. Provide regular professional learning opportunities to build capability and consistency of practice in the agreed pedagogies in reading. Utilise instructional leadership practices to maintain a line of sight for enactment of agreed pedagogical practices. Implement reading targeted whole school observation, coaching, reflection and feedback cycles for teachers. Analyse and respond to data to identify learning needs. Embed reading throughout the Australian Curriculum V9, with clear links to writing. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Teachers implement 3x per week phonics block, utilise shared resources for SSP utilising PLD from the schools OneNote, shared planning for SSP lessons on OneNote, planning time structured into PLCs, teacher aides allocated for implementing consistency of reading. School leaders provide professional development in instructional routines in staff meetings at PFD, sharing of instructional routines resources, support for teachers to attend the Explicit Instruction of Reading PD, agreed expectations of 'review, teach, practice, apply' implemented within reading and SSP lessons, teacher aides supporting implementation of SSP. Teachers engage in PLCs once per week, targeted identification and review of appropriate pedagogies in alignment to moderation professional focus on HITS through Co-Lab team, 4x staff meetings allocated to professional learning in HITS, 4 x staff meeting for reading co-lab team. Leaders and teachers engage in development of wellbeing committee, working collaboratively to align with department resources to develop and implement an action plan, with a range of targeted strategies to improve the areas of wellbeing identified by the team. All staff members working collaboratively to identify areas in which staff morale can improve. Engage in reading behaviours in and out of school weekly. Student achievement in AC reading assessments increasing. Teachers can/will: Plan structure, sequential lessons to build phonic knowledge. Use lesson sequence of Review, teach, practice, and apply. Monitor progress with screening tool. Analyse student data to inform groups. Differentiate for groups within the class. Enact well established daily and weekly routines. Access shared resources. Utilise the High Impact Teaching Strategies to engage students in the learning. Engage in learning walk and talks with teachers to reflect on evidence of learning. Participating in teacher-led data analysis discussions to monitor student improvement and reflect on practice. Reduction of red tape in day-to-day work, planning and processes include: Planning: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Three Levels of Planning documents (Yearly, Term, Weekly/Unit) are simplified and standardised across all year levels to ensure consistency and reduce duplication. Use shared digital templates and resources for reading and phonics planning to minimise time spent creating new documents. Administration and Communication <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Streamline communication through weekly memo summarising key actions, deadlines, and professional learning instead of multiple emails. 		Processes: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Review meeting structures to streamline collaboration time. Use existing communication platforms (e.g., OneDrive, SharePoint, OneNote) for storing and sharing reading resources, coaching feedback, and data, avoiding duplication and version confusion. Maintenance and communication of STEWB support to reduce need for re-referrals. 		Professional Learning: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Prioritise in-house, targeted professional learning led by the co-labs to reduce reliance on external sessions and travel time. Embed short, bite-sized professional learning during staff or team meetings rather than creating additional sessions. Outcome of Red Tape Reduction By implementing these measures: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Teachers and teacher aides can dedicate more time to high-impact teaching and less to administrative tasks. School-wide consistency will lead to improved quality of practice with reduced workload.
